Annex: Brief description of the selection procedure

The IYPT Australia Challenge

Description of the selection procedure

Australian IMO: Brisbane Girls Grammar School, BGGS

BGGS has organized the IYPT Australia Challenge as the basis of the selection procedure of the Australian Team to attend the International Young Physicists' Tournament, IYPT, since 2003. BGGS has hosted the event on many occasions and has invited other schools across Australia to host.

BGGS are confirmed as host of the event for 2018 and 2019.

BGGS selects *seven problems* from the seventeen set problems for IYPT. These are released as soon as possible after the IOC meetings of IYPT at the end July/start August.

Schools enter a team of up to three students into the IYPT Australia Challenge. The team selects three problems to research theoretical and experimental solutions. All team members will be required to act as Reporter and Opponent at least once at the competition. They will report their own research but may have to oppose any of the seven problems. There will be an entry fee to cover catering at the competition.

Competition Days

The IYPT Australia Challenge will be held on two days in December. It will have three rounds of *Physics Fights* between two teams so that each team has reported and opposed in each round. The *Team Score* will be determined by the sum of the scores achieved in each round. Each individual will attain an *Individual Score* based upon the total of their best report and best opposition scores.

Australian Selection

The team with the highest *Team Score* is declared Australian Champions and all members are invited to join the Australian Team. Individuals with the highest *Individual Scores*, not in the winning team, are discussed by all jurors and two are invited to join the Australian Team. Any selected Australian Team Member is accompanied by a Team Leader/Supervisor from their school. The Australian Team will normally be formed from two or three schools.

Schools from 6 States/Territories of Australia have competed at the IYPT Australia Challenge: Queensland, New South Wales, Australian Capital Territory, Victoria, Western Australia and Tasmania. Students from five of these have been selected in the Australian Teams. The 2018 Australian Team has students from Brisbane in Queensland, Perth in Western Australia and Hobart in Tasmania.

Management/Registration of the Australian Team

BGGS as IMO will co-ordinate the IYPT registration process. It will pre-register the Australian Team and manage the entry of data into the formal IYPT Registration System. It will invoice the qualified schools and transfer the Registration Fee to IYPT.

The IMO nominated IOC Member will attend the IOC meetings of IYPT or if they are unable to do so the IMO will organize a suitable IYPT experienced alternative to attend.
