Regulations for Crossing the Georgian Border in connection with the COVID-19 pandemic

> Entry rules for COVID-19 vaccinated visitors

Citizens of all countries, traveling from any country are able to enter Georgia, if they:

<u>While traveling by air</u> present the document confirming the full course (two doses, one dose in case of Johnson&Johnson) of any COVID-19 vaccination at the border checkpoints of Georgia.

<u>While crossing the land and sea border of Georgia</u> present the document confirming the full course (two doses, one dose in case of Johnson&Johnson) of any COVID-19 vaccination at the border checkpoints of Georgia, as well as the negative PCR test taken in the last 72 hours prior to the visit to Georgia.

*Except for any person traveling from the Republic of India (regardless of citizenship and full course of vaccination) as well as persons having a history of travel to the Republic of India for the last 14 days. They are subject to a negative PCR test conducted in the last 72 hours prior to the visit to Georgia at the border and then - a mandatory 14-day quarantine (in the case of foreigners, at their own expense).

- They must travel directly from the above-mentioned countries, including transit travel through third countries.
- At the border checkpoint they shall present a negative result of the PCR test conducted in the last 72 hours prior their visit to Georgia.
- On the 3rd day of their stay, they are obliged to undergo PCR-examination at their own expense.
- Before crossing the state border, they must complete the special application form, indicating the
 travel history of the last 14 days, contact details (address, phone number, email
 etc.) https://registration.gov.ge/pub/form/8 protocol for arrivals in georgia/tk6157/
- All individuals who have travelled to the Republic of India within the last 14 days will be placed in
 a mandatory quarantine for 14 days upon entry at their own expense. In this case, PCRexamination on 3rd day of their stay will be waived.

All other travelers are entitled to request an entry permit to Georgia through the Business Application

Please note when filling out the application:

- The application review period is 10 working days
- You can enter the country only after receiving an e-mail confirmation of entrance permit

The decision on granting permission to enter Georgia is issued by relevant sectoral agencies (Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development of Georgia, Ministry of Regional Development and Infrastructure of Georgia, Minister of Internally Displaced Persons from the Occupied Territories, Labour, Health and Social Affairs of Georgia, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia, Ministry of Environmental Protection and Agriculture of Georgia, Ministry of Education, Science, Culture And Sport of Georgia, Tbilisi City Municipality, Ministry of Finance and Economy of the Autonomous Republic of Adjara). The decision will be notified to the applicant via electronic mail.

The relevant sectoral agency grants permission to business-visitor to enter Georgia based on one of the two conditions:

- a) conducting a PCR-test;
- b) mandatory quarantine

The foreign traveler, who have entered Georgia based on business trip permission in obliged to undergo PCR- examination at his/her own expense at the border checkpoint. Before receiving the test result, the traveler is obliged to spend 24 hours in hotel designated for quarantine. If the result of the PCR-examination is negative, business visitor has to go through one of the two measures, according to the decision of the relevant sectoral agency:

- a) conduct a PCR- examination once every 72 hours during 12 days, at his/her own expense;
- b) go through mandatory 8-days quarantine at his/her own expense and conduct PCR- examination before leaving the quarantine zone, as well as in case of revealing symptoms of Covid-19.
