Annex: Brief description of the selection procedure

Annex 1

Brief Description of Selection to Team Sweden

The IYPT in Sweden starts already in the spring prior to the coming IYPT year when an invitation is sent out to all pupils and teachers in Sweden (via email, on our website, on social media and through our partner channels) to pre-register for next year's IYPT. Pre-registrations means that they may be invited to a summer camp to get a feel for what the IYPT is like.

The IYPT proper starts as soon as the new problems are published. An electronic invitation to schools/pupils to sign up for the IYPT in Sweden is sent to all eligible high school's in Sweden (those with IB programme, natural sciences programme and/or the engineering programme) by email as well as publishing on our website, facebook and Instagram together with the list of current IYPT problems. The application is free.

The deadline for applications is around Christmas before the IYPT final year. All those students who have applied must then submit their presentation as a file (Powerpoint or equivalent) and a screencast in February of the current IYPT year. These submissions are then graded by an internal committee and the best 10 to 12 applicants are selected and called to a National Selection in late March or early April. There is no regional selection currently. Currently at national selection students compete as individuals.

On the day of the national selection, students are required to present and defend their presentation in an IYPT style reduced fight along with another pupil who acts as opponent. There is no reviewer. Every student must present once and oppose once and are graded by a panel of judges (teachers, professors). The current IYPT scoresheet is used and the same clock and timings are used as in the IYPT finals. Pupils should not oppose the problem that they have been working on. Presentation grades are multiplied by a factor of 3 and opposition scores by a factor of 2. At the end of the day, the ranking of pupils' total score is discussed by the jury committee and Team Sweden (the best 5 candidates) is announced either on the day or shortly after.
